- As per the request by the Social Enterprise Department of the Ministry of Employment and Labor of Korea, the information on the Social Value Index has been revised. The sentence “*The existing legal definition of social enterprises requires them to use the Social Value Index, which is mainly composed of more administrative performance indicators.*” has been deleted. The following information has been added instead: “*The Ministry of Employment and Labour of Korea developed the Social Value Index (SVI) in 2016 to objectively measure the social value and performance created by social enterprises. In a survey conducted by the Ministry in 2021, 41.8% of the companies that participated in the SVI measurement responded that they used it to reflect and improve their business performance.*”
