Draft Annotated Agenda

- 1. Since 2016, the GREEN Action Task Force, (and previously under the name of the EAP Task Force) has been a unique platform for interested OECD countries and development co-operation partners to work with the countries of Eastern Europe, Caucasus and Central Asia (EECCA) to develop policies that improve environmental quality and social well-being, while creating opportunities for strong economic growth and decent jobs.
- 2. Guided by the biennial programmes of work, a wide range of activities carried out in cooperation with national and international partners have generated several tangible results on the ground. The work of the Task Force was recognised and appreciated by the Task Force members at the annual meetings held in: Almaty in 2017, Bratislava in 2018, Paris 2019 and at the two virtual meetings in 2020 and 2021.
- 3. After two years of the COVID-19 pandemic and the GREEN Action Task Force meetings being held virtually, the 2022 annual meeting will be held in person in Tbilisi, Georgia. The meeting will bring together official representatives from the Ministries of Environment and of Economy from the countries of Eastern Europe, the Caucasus and Central Asia (EECCA), the OECD member countries as well as partner international organisations, financial institutions, and the representatives of the environmental citizens organisations and the private sector.
- 4. The 2022 Annual meeting will provide an opportunity for members and partners to:
 - Exchange views on the recent developments and plans related to "greening" the economic recovery policies from COVID-19 pandemic;
 - Discuss the environmental and economic consequences of the Russian invasion of Ukraine on climate policies in the EECCA region;
 - Evaluate progress in implementing the GREEN Action Task Force work programme since the last meeting in October 2021 and highlight selected results;
 - Review the preparations of the GREEN Action Task Force inputs to 9th "Environment for Europe" Ministerial Conference (5-7 October in Nicosia, Cyprus).
 - Discuss the future direction of the GREEN Task Force after the 9th "Environment for Europe"
 Ministerial Conference, including the main elements of the 2023-24 Programme of Work of the GREEN Action Task Force.

	For more than two last years the COVID-19 pandemic has been an unprecedented global health, social and economic challenge. Governments around the world, including in the EECCA region, have adapted their short-, medium- and long-term national strategies to stimulate post-COVID-19 economic recovery.
	The Secretariat will provide an update on the trends related to greening the COVID-19 economic response measures and recovery packages throughout the EECCA region on the basis of the findings

presented in a background document "The environmental effects of COVID-19 related recovery measures in the EECCA region" [ENV/EPOC/EAP(2022)4]. The Secretariat will also provide an update on the ongoing work of the green recovery advisory programme in Moldova, Kyrgyzstan and Uzbekistan. Task Force members will be invited to discuss the analysis and engage in a discussion on the impacts of the COVID-19 crisis on the environment as well as the policy responses they prioritise for a resilient, sustainable and inclusive economic recovery. 16:00 - 16:30 Coffee break 16:30 - 18:00 Item 4: Effects of the Russian invasion of Ukraine on climate and energy policies in the European Union's Eastern Partnership and Central Asian countries [ENV/EPOC/EAP(2022)6] Russia's invasion of Ukraine has resulted in horrendous consequences for people and the economy of Ukraine. The most important are the lives lost and the humanitarian crisis associated with the huge numbers of besieged and displaced people. Recent estimates of damage to the infrastructure total USD 105.5 billion which, beyond bare figures, mean vast destruction to of thousands of homes, civilian infrastructure, agricultural land and practically all other features of a country. Whilst Ukraine is clearly and without any comparability the victim, the war has also led to massive geopolitical and economic consequences beyond Ukraine. The impacts are global, but in virtue to its historical and geographical proximity, of particular relevance for the EECCA region that once, together with Russia, were part of the Soviet Union. The Co-Chair will invite a representative of Ukraine to share with the Task Force members information about the impact of war on the Ukraine economy, population and environment and present steps that the Ukraine Government and the population are taking to prepare for post-war reconstruction. The Co-Chair will also invite experts from Berlin Economics to introduce their analysis of the impact of war on climate and energy policies in the EECCA countries presented a paper "Effects of the Russian invasion of Ukraine on climate and energy policies in the European Union's Eastern Partnership and Central Asian countries" [ENV/EPOC/EAP(2022)6]. The paper was prepared as part of a project "Low Carbon Ukraine" that supports the Ukrainian government with demand-driven analyses and policy proposals to promote the transition towards a low-carbon economy. The project is part of the International Climate Initiative and is funded by the German Federal Ministry for the Environment, Nature Conservation, Nuclear Safety, and Consumer Protection. Task Force members will be invited to share their views on the impacts of war on their climate

policies, present the steps taken to accelerate the drive towards net zero emissions and
