Mr. Sicars holds a Master's Degree in Mechanical Engineering from the University of Hanover, Germany, specialised in Energy- and Process Engineering.

He was working for, and subsequently managing, the Research Centre for Refrigeration and Heat Pumps (FKW) in Germany. Later, he worked as a consultant on environmental issues undertaking research projects for clients such as international industries, NGOs and

governments. He implemented Montreal Protocol projects in India and China, and for eight years, he was part of delegations to the Executive Committee of the Multilateral Fund and to the Meeting of the Parties of the Montreal Protocol. He was a member of the Refrigeration Technical Option Committee and of the TEAP task forces, was also a coordinating lead author for IPCC, and received the US-EPA Ozone Award.

Subsequently, he worked as a Senior Programme Officer with the Multilateral Fund. In June 2014, he was appointed Director of the Montreal Protocol Branch, and in February 2015, Director of the newly created Department of Environment of UNIDO.
