Richard Baron manages the OECD Round Table on Sustainable Development, organizing a series of high-level public-private meetings to advance discussions on pressing environmental questions. He is also the coordinator of the horizontal project *Aligning Policies for a Low-Carbon Economy* which involves the OECD, the International Energy Agency (IEA), the International Transport Forum and the Nuclear Energy Agency on. Until 2013, he was the head of climate change at the IEA where his work included international negotiations, carbon market mechanisms, industrial competitiveness and sectoral approaches, and the role of electricity in decarbonisation.

Mr. Baron has been working on the linkages between climate change and energy policy since 1989. Prior to his positions at IEA and OECD, he worked in France at Cired, Iddri, and the Department of Energy's Pacific Northwest Laboratory. He is member of the Economic Council for Sustainable Development, an advisory group to the French Minister for ecology, sustainable development and energy. He holds a degree from Ecole Supérieure des Sciences Economiques et Commerciales and an advanced degree in theoretical and applied economics from DELTA (Paris School of Economics).
