



Marissa PLOUIN, an urban policy specialist, coordinates the OECD Champion Mayors for Inclusive Growth initiative, a global coalition of mayors who have committed to advance more inclusive economic development. She is also developing a new area of work on the policy implications of digital innovation in cities, working with public and private partners.
