In coordination with the PMO and its counterparts, the OECD is implementing the EU-funded project "Support the Palestinian Authority to enhance Governance and the Rule of Law" (2020-2024). The overall objective of the project is to support the Palestinian Authority and contribute to achieving a more effective, transparent and participatory policy- and law-making process set in a clear normative framework, and thus enhance citizens and businesses trust in their government's action. More specifically, the project will aim at enhancing the capacity of law and policy-makers to:

- Produce clear, effective and transparent primary and secondary legislation,
- Use efficient public consultation mechanisms as part of the policy development process,
 and
- Develop (and improve) online tools providing access to adopted and draft legislation.

The activities

The activities will be delivered by a local expert (in-person). Peers from OECD member countries will intervene remotely to share best practices from OECD countries in terms of policy and legislative development.
