That way, any Colombian who wants to buy a good from a seller abroad and use local means for payment through payment gateways (such as cash payments, insurance payments online (PES) or even electronic deposits), must submit the corresponding import declaration directly. According to current regulations, this declaration must be filed personally, without intermediaries or agents for payment (such as, for example, payment gateways) acting as agents for such purposes.
