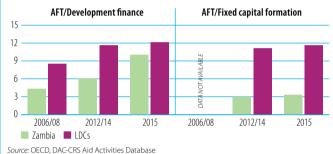

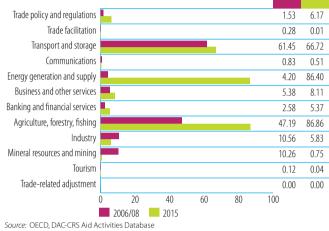

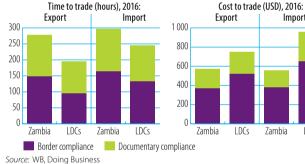

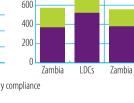

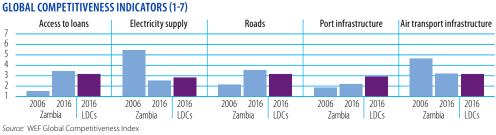

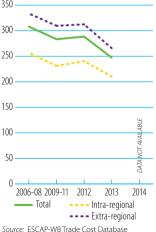
TRADE FACILITATION INDICATORS, 2015 (0-2)
