A Seminar on European Competition Law for National Judges

O Budapest, Hungary

30 November – 1 December 2023

Seminar objectives

The Hungarian Competition Authority (GVH) will hold a competition law seminar for judges in the framework of the OECD-GVH Regional Centre for Competition in Budapest (RCC) on **30 November–1 December 2023 in Budapest** as part of the **Single Market Programme** of the European Commission. The seminar will receive funding from the European Union.

The event entitled "*Stepping up with the economics of competition law: between competition and regulation*" aims at assisting judges to deal with economic concepts and tests when addressing antitrust cases. Participants will gain a better understanding of the economic reasoning underlying the EU competition law framework and its enforcement in digital and regulated markets. Particular attention will be dedicated to market power, factors affecting competition, theories of harm and the effects of regulation on parameters of competition. Participants will increase their awareness on how digital and regulated markets operate and how to assess business practices in such markets under EU competition law.

The topics will be addressed and discussed by **competition experts from OECD member countries**. Practical exercises on hypothetical cases involving all participants will provide a great opportunity to apply the learnings of the seminar in practice. Furthermore, participants will be engaged in Q&A sessions with the experts and will be encouraged to share their experience with one another to promote further cooperation and networking.

We encourage judges who wish to increase their understanding of competition law to participate in the seminar. Please be informed that the seminar is open to national judges, prosecutors and apprentice national judges who are dealing with competition law issues in one of the eligible countries of the Single Market Programme.

Each applicant is kindly requested to indicate their prior experience in general European competition law.

Please note that a good command of English is a prerequisite for the registration. **Participation in the seminar** will be free of charge; the costs will be covered by EU and GVH funds.

One place will be reserved for one applicant from each of the eligible countries. In case of multiple applications from the same country, candidates will be selected on the basis of a number of criteria, including the institution of the applicants, their position, the years of relevant experience and previous pertinent training.

Participants shall arrange their own travel and their travel expenses (economy class) will be reimbursed by the organizers after the seminar. The cost of local transportation (taxi, airport shuttle, public transport) and the cost of travel insurance will not be reimbursed. The organizers will take care of the reservations and cover the costs of accommodation for three nights starting **from the night of 29 November to the night of 1 December 2023**. Participants will be invited to a dinner on 30 November and will receive lunch on both days of the seminar.

Please be informed that a necessary precondition for reimbursement is actual participation in the entire training, which means that if someone cannot participate for any reason whatsoever, we cannot reimburse their costs. It is important to specify that the participant will be liable for refunding any costs incurred due to the modification or cancellation of a registration that has already been accepted by the event organisers.

Please note that the deadline for submitting your registration is **11 September 2023**. Applicants will be notified by 22 September 2023 if their registration has been accepted.
