

Improving strategic planning (2019-20)

- Draft Water Strategy till 2030 passed public hearings in **Belarus** and passed to the UNECE-led SEA stage (2019)
- Roundtables on conceptualising Ukraine's water strategy (Lviv, July & September 2019)
- Inter-ministerial consultation on new national water strategy in **Georgia** (2019)
- Cross-sector consultation on draft water strategy and its action plan for implementation in **Azerbaijan** ahead of approval (2019-20)







4. Strengthening Water Management: Progress and Impact

Increasing water security

- New norms for water use and wastewater discharges developed and introduced by water-intensive enterprises in **Belarus** (November 2019)
- Approval of methodologies for monitoring "nationalised" SDG 6.3-6.5 indicators in **Belarus** (November 2019). The methodologies were elaborated with support from EUWI+.
- Approval of a new State Programme on Water Supply and Sanitation in **Kyrgyzstan** (June 2020). The programme was elaborated in line with recommendations developed with support of the GREEN Action Task Force through the recent FinWaterWEI-II programme.
- Adoption of an updated national Water Supply and Sanitation Strategy to 2030 and associated mid-term Action Plan in **Moldova** (July 2020). Its implementation will help ensure access to safe drinking water and proper sanitation in line with SDG 6 and improve living standards and health and contribute to the country's green economic development.
- Adoption of the Code of Practice establishing new norms for design and construction of small-scale water supply systems in **Moldova** (September 2020). The packages in **Moldova** were elaborated with support of the GREEN Action Task Force through EUWI+
