


# 2022 Annual Conference of the OECD Global Forum on Productivity

The 2022 Annual Conference of the Global Forum on Productivity "Challenges for productivity growth in the post COVID-19 era" is a jointly organised event by the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) and the European Commission.

The Conference will bring together high-level policy makers, top academics and representatives from the private sector. It will be a unique opportunity to discuss the various challenges of the post COVID-19 period, including the green transition, digitalisation, the reallocation of resources and the potential re-organisation of value chains. In this context, policy makers will play a key role to facilitate the associated restructuring of our economies and to ensure solid productivity growth.

The 2022 Annual Conference of the Global Forum on Productivity will take place on Thursday 7 July and Friday 8 July in Brussels, Belgium, at the Bozar Palace of Fine Arts. The Conference will be held in a hybrid format.

Due to security measures, they are advised to come early (at least 30 minutes in advance) to allow enough time to access the building before the Conference starts.

# **Remote Participation**

If on-site attendance is not possible, the organising team will provide the opportunity to attend the event online.

Registered participants will receive a confirmation email upon completing the registration form. Access links to follow the event remotely will be sent to registrants 24h ahead of the scheduled start.

# Transportation and accommodation

# **Transportation**

Taxis can be easily found in the main avenues and hotels can provide specific services. It is recommended to agree to the fare with the driver before the travel. In the city center, the public transportation network (metro, tram and bus) is managed by the Brussels Intermunicipal Transport Company.

# **Access from the Airport**

The Bozar Palace of Fine Arts is twelve kilometres away from the Brussels Airport (BRU) and sixty kilometres away from the Brussels South Charleroi Airport.

Specific transportation services, taxis and private transportation are available at the airport.

# **Access from the Train Station**

The Bozar Palace of Fine Arts is 200 meters away from the Brussels Central Railway Station which has frequent and easy connection to Brussels-South Railway Station (Gare de Bruxelles Midi), the main hub station used by all mainline trains serving Brussels (including Eurostar to London, Thalys to Paris, Amsterdam and Cologne, intercity trains to Luxembourg).


Specific transportation services (bus, taxis, and private transportation) are available at the station.

# **Practical information**

# Brussels

Brussels, city capital of Belgium is located in the valley of the Senne. Greater Brussels is the country's largest urban agglomeration. It consists of 19 communes, or municipalities, each with a large measure of administrative autonomy. The largest commune - which, like the greater metropolitan area, is named Brussels - contains the historic core of the city and the so-called "European Quarter," where the institutions of the European Union (EU) are located. As the seat of the EU, Brussels is known as the "capital of Europe," and its significance as a center of international governance and business makes Brussels a true global city.



### Language

Belgium has three official languages: French, Dutch and German. In Brussels, the most common language is French. However, in recent years, Flemish is gaining importance. Most Belgians also speak or at least understand English. In hotels and restaurants, employees will normally speak English, especially in the more touristy areas.

# **Time**

In Belgium the standard time is Central European Time (UTC+01:00). Belgium observes Summer Time (daylight saving time) from the last Sunday in March (02:00 CET) to the last Sunday in October (03:00 CEST). The transition dates are the same as for other European countries.

### **Phone**

The country phone code to reach Belgium is +32. The international prefix for calling a number in Brussels is 00 + the digits of the phone number.

# **Electricity**

Electricity in Brussels is 230 Volts and the frequency is 50 Hz. In Belgium the power plugs and sockets are of type E. Type E is of French origin. This socket also works with plug C and with plug F if it has an additional pinhole. Participants are advised to bring adapters with them, if needed.

# Currency

The euro is the official currency of Belgium. Banks, hotels, and airports provide change services.

# **Climate**

Brussels experiences a mild oceanic climate typical of northern Europe, with cold winters and warm summers. It is cold in the city from approximately late October to early March, with average highs between 4°C (39°F) and 7°C (44.6°F). June, July and August are the hottest months in Brussels. The average high is 23°C (73.4°F) and the average low is 14°C (57°F).
